Program Overview

The Bachelor of Music in Music Therapy trains students in the clinical applications of music, blending musical skills with specialized training in the areas of psychology and the behavioral and natural sciences. Degree candidates will demonstrate technical command of three instruments (voice, guitar, and piano) sufficient to be able to communicate and improvise through music in various clinical settings. Candidates will also complete a music therapy Internship and a capstone research project.

Career Opportunities

Graduates have obtained positions as music therapists in many clinical areas: school, home health agencies, psychiatric hospitals, chemical dependence units, dialysis centers, medical units in a general hospital and nursing homes. Music therapists also are becoming expert in conduct researching in the physiological and psychological effects and uses of music with human beings.

Scholarship and Audition Information

Students interested in music must audition with the Music department, but this audition also qualifies students for scholarships. Music majors can receive up to \$4,000 per year and music minors can receive up to \$800 per year.
