To be eligible to apply, you must:

- have a 3.0 or higher GPA
- be a full time student who has completed at least 12 semester hours at UIW, not exceeding 95 semester hours and not graduating in May 2018
- have a U.S. passport that is valid for at least 6 months or have applied for a passport;
- be in good standing at the university
- available to travel from August 19-26, 2018
- able to purchase roundtrip airfare to Taiwan and international health insurance (selected participants will be expected to purchase airfare within one week of being selected)
